"Stimulating Science and Technology competences through innovative means for teaching and learning"

The STIMULA pilot project

STIMULA is a pilot project financed by the European Commission through their "Lifelong Learning (Comenius) Programme". It involves six partners from Germany, Romania, Spain and the UK. The main objective of this pilot project is to further engage post-primary pupils within Europe in the study of science and technology (S&T). According to PISA 2006, the interest and enjoyment of S&T is positively associated with better performance. During the last two years, the STIMULA team has worked in increasing the motivation towards S&T, and improving and developing key competences in S&T among the European post-primary pupils, providing them with challenging activities.

The findings and conclusions of this pilot project will be useful for people involved in S&T Education. The STIMULA workshop will be devoted to discuss different European experiences for encouraging pupils in the field of S&T as well as to present the main results of the project.
