IncluSTEM Presentation (10 min)

Explanation of the objectives of the IncluSTEM Project and course.

CULTURE / INTERCULTURAL TOOL SET

15:00 – 16:00 Welcome to the App: Download & install

(Warm-up Sequence)

In this session we will work with the participants to find out what background they have and with what ideas they come to this course. An initial prospective exercise will be facilitated on what they understand (based on social meanings and senses) by different concepts such as culture, interculturality, race, ethnocentrism/Eurocentrism, nation, agency, intersectionality, state, refugee, development, etc. If the number of participants allows it, they can be divided into groups to work on each concept or group of concepts (or worksheet) and then share it with the rest of the group in a transition session.

16:00 – 18:00 Intercultural Playbook: A beginner's guide to advanced navigation

Theoretical-critical exploration

Speaker: Dr. Dulcinea Tomás Cámara (UPM/Refuteach)

This session will be a basic but robust exploration of key issues that characterise any approach to concepts related to culture and interculturality. The treatment of the contents is not limited to the merely expository but should challenge the participants through a dynamic proposal that is interconnected with reality. The underlying complexity imposed by an approach to contemporary identity and cultural ecosystems makes it necessary for people who are going to work with heterogeneous groups to acquire a solid conceptual toolkit in order to be able to face their technical and professional work with a critical spirit and a set of specific knowledge and tools.

MIGRATION/ASYLUM TOOL SET

This session will provide a diachronic overview of the history of international protection policies, as well as a basic exploration of key issues and main instruments that characterise any approach to migration and asylum processes.

This session aims to provide basic concepts related to international protection and asylum (internally displaced persons, migrants, international protection, asylum, refuge, etc.),

16:30 -18:00 The reception and integration system in Spain: Structure, process and currents challenges

Speaker: María Zabala (UNHCR)

This session will address the reception system in Spain, as well as the current reception programme (international protection, subsidiary or residence for humanitarian reasons, etc.) and its phases, as well as the services included in the integration pathway and its main challenges and opportunities.

HANDS-ON TRAINING

Structured talks are given by experts in different subjects that affect the spheres and processes of inclusion, interculturality and migrations in everyday social spaces. Each lecture is divided into two parts: an expository part and a part in which to work on the contents taught in an applied way.
