

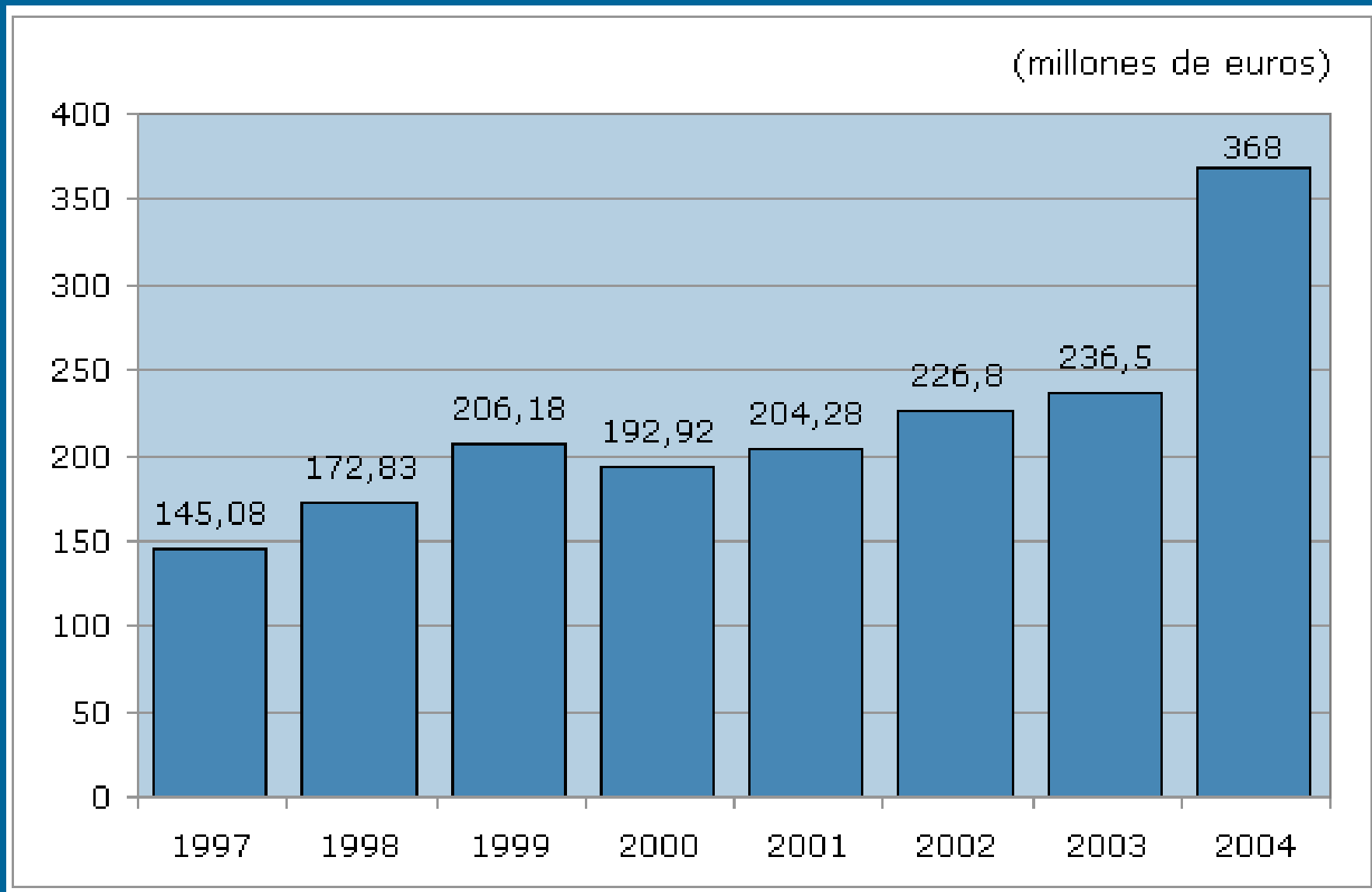

- The Centre for the Development of Industrial Technology (CDTI) is a Spanish public organisation, under the Ministry of Industry, Commerce and Tourism, whose objective is to help Spanish companies to increase the technological profile of said companies.
- The Centre is governed by private law in its relations with third parties. This allows to offer swift and flexible support services to Spanish companies for the development of R&D&I business projects and international exploitation of technologies developed by companies. Its functions are:

- To evaluate and finance technological development, innovation and modernization projects developed by Spanish companies
- To manage the Spanish participation in international programmes of technological cooperation – IBEROEKA, EUREKA, CHINEKA
- To promote technology transfer and technological cooperation between enterprises
- To support the generation and development of new technology base firms, through the NEOTEC Initiative.

## **CENIT: National Strategic Consortia of Technological Research**

- It is expected to increase the public-private cooperation in R+D+i through the constitution of the CENIT  
Furthermore, the programme will create a **risk capital** fund with **200 million euro to start in January 2006**, which will permit a four-fold increase in the creation of Business Technology
- It is also expected, to promote the involvement of university doctors/researchers in the private sector by means of the Torres Quevedo Programme
- Managed by **CDTI**

- Expected to promote research, by means of a project group involving large consortia or lone operators
- Will mobilise 1,500 million euro in the next four years approximately 50 percent will be contributed by Government.
- Plan 13 concerning incentives for research activities
- Will have a budget of 130 million euro for the next three years, will allow universities and public research organisations to attract 900 more expert researchers from Spain and abroad.

- Avanz@: this programme is designed to help reach the European average in terms of Information Society indicators
- share of businesses using electronic commerce by 8 percent to 55 percent
- share of availability E-administration by 22% 40%
- double the number of houses with Internet access
- provide educational institutions with one Internet connection for every two students.
